

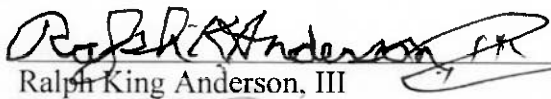

ORDER

In Re: E-Filing System and E-Filing Policies

The South Carolina Administrative Law Court (ALC or Court) established an E-Filing System for the electronic filing and exchange of documents with the Court. To implement the E-Filing System, the Court adopted the ALC's E-Filing Policies pursuant to Rule 4(B), SCALCR, on September 29, 2022. On December 1, 2024, the Court began allowing the voluntary usage of the E-Filing System for authorized attorneys. At that time, the Court also gave notice that subject to limited exceptions e-filing would be required in the future by attorneys. The Court has now determined that the use of the system should be mandatory for all attorneys consistent with the ALC's E-Filing Policies. Accordingly, mandatory usage of the E-Filing System shall be required beginning on November 12, 2025.

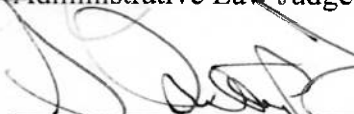
